You are welcome to use this resource and share it freely. Please keep this file in its original and intended form, without seeking financial gain for its use.

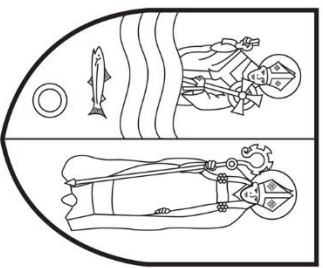
Directions—print the following A4 page. Various art supplies will have a different effect depending on the paper, its weight, surface finish and manufacturing process. Copier paper (70-80gsm) would be sufficient for pens, pencils and crayons, thicker paper (100-120gsm) could accommodate felt tip markers, and 150+gsm paper could be used for inks and watercolours.
