-  Consider replacing the cleaning products you use with more natural alternatives. Pay special attention to eliminating products containing glyphosate and metaldehyde.
-  Start a compost heap or compost bin! That single lump of decaying matter can become a whole ecosystem of worms, beetles, flies, woodlice, amphibians, and even reptiles like slow worms and grass snakes.

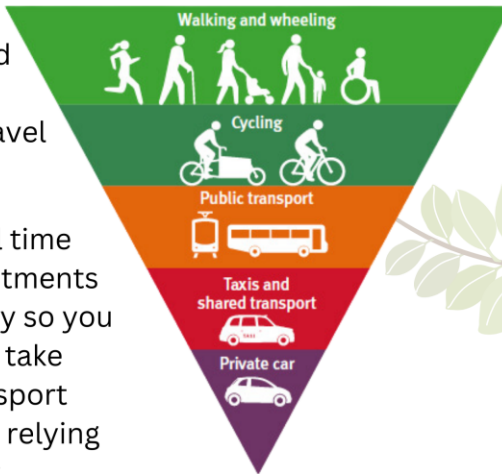

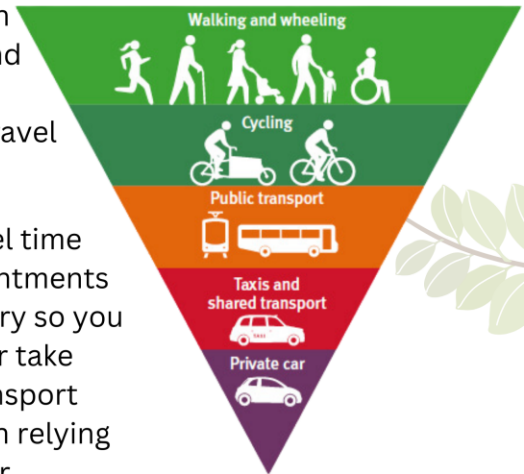
