Dear Friend,

Thank you for taking the time to explore this post - and for considering whether God might be calling you to share in the life of East Kilbride and Cambuslang. This is a fulltime post funded initially for three years by resources of the two vestries and supplemented by a Ministry Support Grant from the Diocesan Council to discern the next chapter of ministry and mission in these charges.

We're entering a new and hopeful season in the Diocese of Glasgow and Galloway. There is a growing sense of energy and possibility as we rediscover what it means to be the Church in this time and place. At the heart of it all is our desire to be a 'Church for Everyone' - a Eucharistic community where all are welcomed, where gifts are recognised, and where people grow in faith, service, and joy.

East Kilbride and Cambuslang are two faithful and friendly congregations on the outskirts of Glasgow, who have travelled through a vacancy with grace and resilience. They are now looking to the future with openness and hope - ready to welcome a new priest who will walk alongside them, help deepen their life of worship and prayer, and support their desire to serve their wider communities.

You'll find this is a place where lay ministry is valued, ecumenical relationships are strong, and spiritual growth is taken seriously. There is a desire here not simply to maintain what has been, but to listen together for what the Spirit is doing next.

You won't be on your own. As bishop, I'm committed to building a diocesan culture that is relational, collaborative, and renewing. We're investing in the wellbeing and formation of our clergy, supporting one another through learning groups, retreats, and practical resources. If you join us, you'll be part of a network of encouragement as we seek to become the church we are called to be.

We are an open and inclusive church where all are invited to the table, and these two charges have indicated their support for the ministry of priests who may wish to celebrate equal marriage. We would work with you to ensure this is navigated pastorally and respectfully within the local context.
